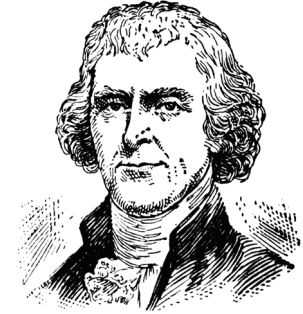


HELP THOMAS JEFFERSON BUY SHEEP!

Did you know...?

President Jefferson had his own herd of sheep and often bought sheep from Europe so he could study the different types. He especially liked a type of sheep called a “Barbary Broadtail,” or a Tunis. He liked the flavor of their meat and the quality of their wool. When President Jefferson attended James Madison’s Inauguration in 1809, he wore a coat made from the wool of American sheep, saying:

“Homespun is become the spirit of the times. I think it an useful one, and therefore that it is a duty to encourage it by example.”
