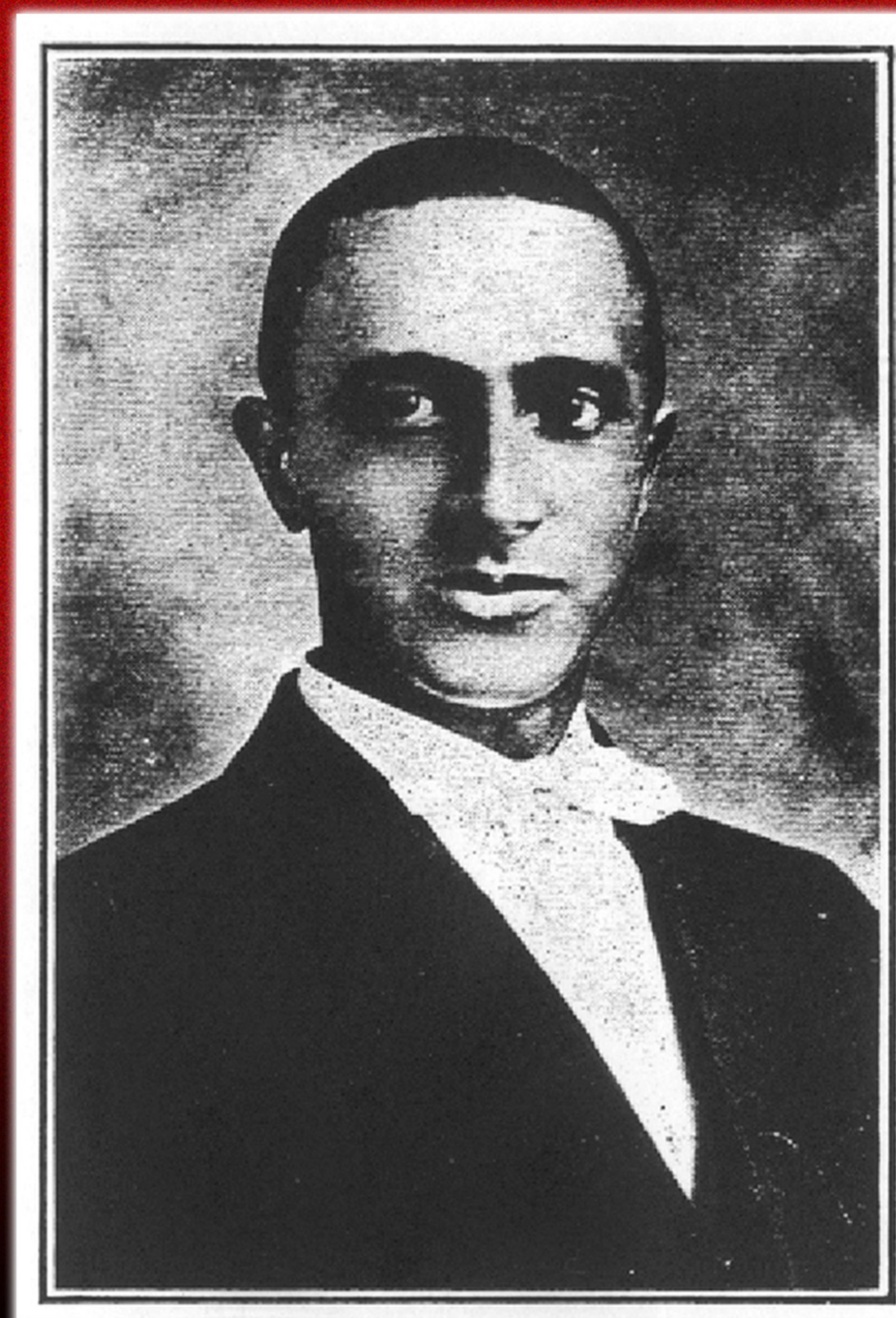
Three people whose life and work
