Judge, sheriff, jury, and executioner, the Choctaw Lighthorse maintained law and order in the Choctaw Nation. As captain, Peter Conser was responsible for preserving order and discipline among the men and ensuring each man was properly armed, equipped, and mounted. During the Civil War Conser sought refuge on the Red River plantation of Choctaw Robert M. Jones. Having enjoyed the bountiful crops of the Jones plantation, Conser returned to the Hodgens area following the war, and began farming. Gradually he accumulated considerable wealth and with his new affluence came social recognition. In 1894 Conser completed a two-story home with eight rooms to house his large family.
