GRANDFIELD AREA HISTORIC SURVEY

1 GRA. Camp Auger (1871-1874)

General Location: West and South of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: Sections 31 and 32, both in T4S, R15W; Section 1, T5S, R15W.

Description:

Camp Auger is located on the north side of the Red River. Several old pits are still visible, roughly 10 feet across, at the edge of the terrace; the Camp has an excellent view of the river valley, both upstream and downstream, for several miles. Surface material has been found at the location for many years, including prehistoric Indian pottery and flint tools. Historic cartridges, glass, and other material dating to the Camp Auger occupation, has also been found on the surface. The site is recommended for the National list and is on the State List.

2 GRA. Eschiti (1907)

General Location: 1 mile east, 2 mile north of Grandfield, Oklahoma Legal Location: No of Section 3, T4S, R14W

Description: The Town of Eschiti was platted as one of five (5) government townsites in the opening of the Big Pasture in 1907, but competition from a private townsite named Kell City caused the two towns to merge in 1909 to form Grandfield. The Eschiti site is now a bare, plowed field and an open pasture with two, small, nearly-forgotten, cemeteries. The site is not recommended for the National list.

3 GRA. Diltston Post Office (1903)

General Location: 5 miles north, 4 miles west of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: Section 10, T3S, R15W

Description: Section 10 is now a cotton field, with small strips of wheat fields interspersed. The community included a Post Office from 1902 to 1904, but the site is now too indefinite to locate exactly. It is not recommended for either the State

or National lists.

4 GRA. Sage (1908)

General Location: 5 miles south, 2 miles west of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: Section 5, T3S, R14W

Description: The Sage Community included a Post Office (1908-1909), a School (Sage School #260, 1908-1959), a doctor's office, and numerous residences. The site is not recommended for either

the State or National lists.

5 GRA. Brush Creek School #226 (1908)

General Location: 5 miles north, 2½ miles east of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: SE4, SE4, SW4 of Section 11, T3S, R14W

Description: The school was built in 1908 and disbanded in 1947, when the building was destroyed. The site is a bare, plowed field, with only the concrete top of a well, concrete fragments, clear glass, whiteware, bricks, asbestos shingles and metal fragments. It is not recommended for either the State or National lists.

6 GRA. Sims School #237 (1909)

General Location: 3 miles north, 3 miles east of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: SW2, SW2, SW2 of Section 23, T3S, R14W

Description: The school was built in 1909, and moved from the site in the early 1950's. All that was left at the site (a cotton field) was pieces of metal desk leg, clear glass, crockery and coal. The site is not recommended for either the State or National

7 GRA. Center Point School #248 (1908)

General Location: 3 miles east of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: SW%, SW% of Section 1, T4S, R14W

Description: The site is a bare, plowed field, with scattered coal, clear glass, whiteware and two large rocks, but no evidence of a foundation. The school was built in 1908, but was moved to Grandfield in 1947, and the land returned to farming. The site is not recommended for either the State or National lists.

Grandfield Cemetery 8 GRA.

General Location: 1 mile east, 2 mile north of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: St, NW and Nt, SW4 of Section 3, T4S, R14W

Description: The Grandfield Cemetery is surrounded by a modern, chain link fence, with brick pillars at intervals. The oldest grave in the approximately 500-grave cemetery dates from 1901; the cemetery is still in use as a burying ground for Grandfield, and is on the State list.

9 GRA. Union Graded I School (1917)

General Location: 3½ miles west of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: NE%, NE%, NW% of Section 10, T4S, R15W

Description: The site is a wheat field, and has a 50' \times 30' concrete foundation in a group of high weeds, at the edge of the field near U.S. Highway 70. The foundation has a sidewalk on the north side, a $10' \times 20'$ storm cellar, and an open cistern. The site is on the State list.

10 GRA. Spring Valley School #257 (1907 and 1912)

General Location: 2 miles west, 3 miles south of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: SE% of Section 23, T4S, R15W

Description: The first school site (1907) was three (3) miles west and two (2) miles south of Grandfield; when this schoolhouse was destroyed by a tornado in 1912, the new school was built in the center of the School District. The second school was built in 1912, and sold and moved in the 1940's. No evidence of a foundation exists in the bare, plowed field, but scattered concrete fragments, window glass, crockery, coal and whiteware are found. The site is not recommended for either the State or National lists.

11 GRA. Fort Auger School #256 (1908)

General Location: 5 miles west, 4 miles south of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: SE4, SE4, SE4 of Section 29, T4S, R15W

Description: The site is a collection of high weeds, with an intact concrete foundation, 30' x 40', a standing concrete cellar, and an open cistern. A large pile of lumber was found near the foundation. The school was built in 1908 and torn down in 1958. The site is on the State list.

12 GRA. Unknown Church

General Location: 4 miles west, 2 miles south of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: NW% of Section 1, T4S, R15W

Description: The site was a bare, plowed field with no evidence of the Church, except for some scattered window glass and brick fragments. The site is not recommended for either the State or National lists.

13 GRA. Sage School #260 (1908)

General Location: 2 miles west, 5 miles south of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: NW4 of Section 1, T%s, R15W

Description: The site of the school was an open pasture with no evidence of the school that had been built in 1908 and moved in 1966. It is not recommended for either the State or National lists.

14 GRA. Eschiti Cemetery

General Location: 13 miles east, 3 mile north of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: SW4, SW4, SW4 of Section 3, T4S, R14W

Description: The cemetery is all that remains of the old Town of Eschiti (see #2 GRA.), and it has about a dozen stones. The site was very overgrown, but it had been remembered and a list of the stones can be found in the History of Tillman County, Vol. II. The site is on the State list.

15 GRA. Eschiti Methodist Church

General Location: 1 mile east, 3 mile north, 4 mile west of Grandfield, Oklahoma

Legal Location: SE1, SE1, NW1 of Section 3, T4S, R14W

Description: The cemetery was highly overgrown and in an open pasture. A complete list of its 4 marked graves can be found in the History of Tillman County, Vol. II. The site is in danger of being destroyed and forgotten, and has no fence or maintenance. The cemetery is on the State list.

16 GRA. Downtown Cobblestone Building (ca. 1938)
