
My dear Sir:-

I write you this personal letter to inform you that I am a Democratic Candidate before the primaries for United States Senator. I believe my experience has qualified me to serve your interests and the interests of the State effectively in the Senate of the United States.

My activities in official life; as attorney at law; my large experience in various lines of business; in real estate; in farming; in stock raising; in banking, and in numerous other enterprises, has carried me to every part of the State, and made me well acquainted with the needs of the people of Indian Territory and of Oklahoma.
