BE IT KNOWN, That the undersigned, citizens of the Territory of Oklahoma and of the Indian Territory, do hereby voluntarily associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a private corporation under the laws of the Territory of Oklahoma, and do hereby certify:

FIRST:

4993A

That the name of this Corporation shall be "The Kansas, Okmulgee and Gulf Railroad Company."

SECOND:

That the purpose for which this Corporation is formed is to build own, equip, maintain and operate a line of steam railway from Kansas City in the State of Missouri to a point on the Red River in the Choctaw Nation, Indian Territory at or near the Ninety Sixth Meridian, passing through the County of Jackson in the State of Missouri, the Counties of Wyandotte, Johnson, Douglas, Frankling, Osage, Coffey, Woodson, Wilson, and Montgomery, in the State of Kansas, through the Cherokee, Creek and Choctaw Nations in the Indian Territory, or through such of said Counties and Nations as the said Company's line of road or branches thereof may be finally located; together with a branch line running from Okmulgee in the Indian Territory westerly through the Creek Nation and the Counties of Lincoln, Pottawatomie and Oklahoma in the Territory of Oklahoma, to Oklahoma City in said Oklahoma Territory; Also a branch line running northeasterly from Okmulgee to the east line of the Cherokee Nation. with power to buy, own, lease, mortgage or bond any and all property, both real and personal with all franchise necessary to carry on and conduct said business, and with all other powers given by law to such corporations.
