Historic Oklahoma

Historic Oklahoma is a vertical file of original materials. The collection is arranged alphabetically by topic and includes a biographical series.

1983.193 Korean War Collection

Contains a report from the US House of Representatives about prisoners taken by the Communists during the Korean War, a handwritten list of soldiers from Oklahoma missing during the Korean War, and a State of Oklahoma resolution honoring the soldiers of the Korean War.

2016.174 Marley, Nancy Harlene

Contains personal correspondence to Mr. and Mrs. Harlan Marley and Nancy from John I. Masquelier during his time in the Marine Corps during the Korean War. Correspondence contains the details of life at Camp Pendleton in California and life overseas.

2004.001 Oklahoma War Memorial Collection

The Oklahoma War Memorial Collection houses individual files on Oklahoman men who served and lost their lives in World War II. Most of the files, arranged alphabetically by last name, contain newspaper clippings and biographical information sent by the men's families to the Oklahoma Historical Society. There is also a large collection of newspaper clippings (arranged alphabetically by county) relating to war bonds, headlines, and soldiers from Oklahoma who were killed or missing in action. The collection also contains press releases by the US government, books, and other published material relating to the war and soldiers.
