### **Historic Oklahoma Collection**

Historic Oklahoma is a vertical file of original materials. The collection is arranged alphabetically by topic and includes a biographical series.

### **2013.494 State Historic Preservation Office Collection**

Part of the responsibilities of the Oklahoma State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) include working with federal agencies and reviewing their federally funded, licensed, or permitted projects. If those projects have an impact on an eligible or listed National Register of Historic Places property, SHPO works with the agency to minimize harm. When that cannot be avoided, they work through a mitigation process. As such, many times, that mitigation process results in the documentation of the property before demolition occurs. For each of those properties, a collection of materials, including photographs, maps, contextual documents (property history), modern drawings, historic drawings, oral histories, and historic photographs, is given to SHPO. Each building may have all or a combination of the items listed.

### **2011.187 Oklahoma Main Street Center Collection**

The Oklahoma Main Street Center Collection contains drawings submitted to the Oklahoma Department of Commerce for consideration. The Main Street Center project focuses on preservation-based commercial district revitalization.

### **2012.068 Route 66 Museum Collection**

Posters, maps, and booklets that were previously on display at the Oklahoma Route 66 Museum.

### **2016.117 Warrick, Lucille**

This collection consists of the research of Barbara Lucille Warrick regarding the historical buildings in Edmond, Oklahoma. Included in the collection are materials from the Oklahoma Route 66 Association.
